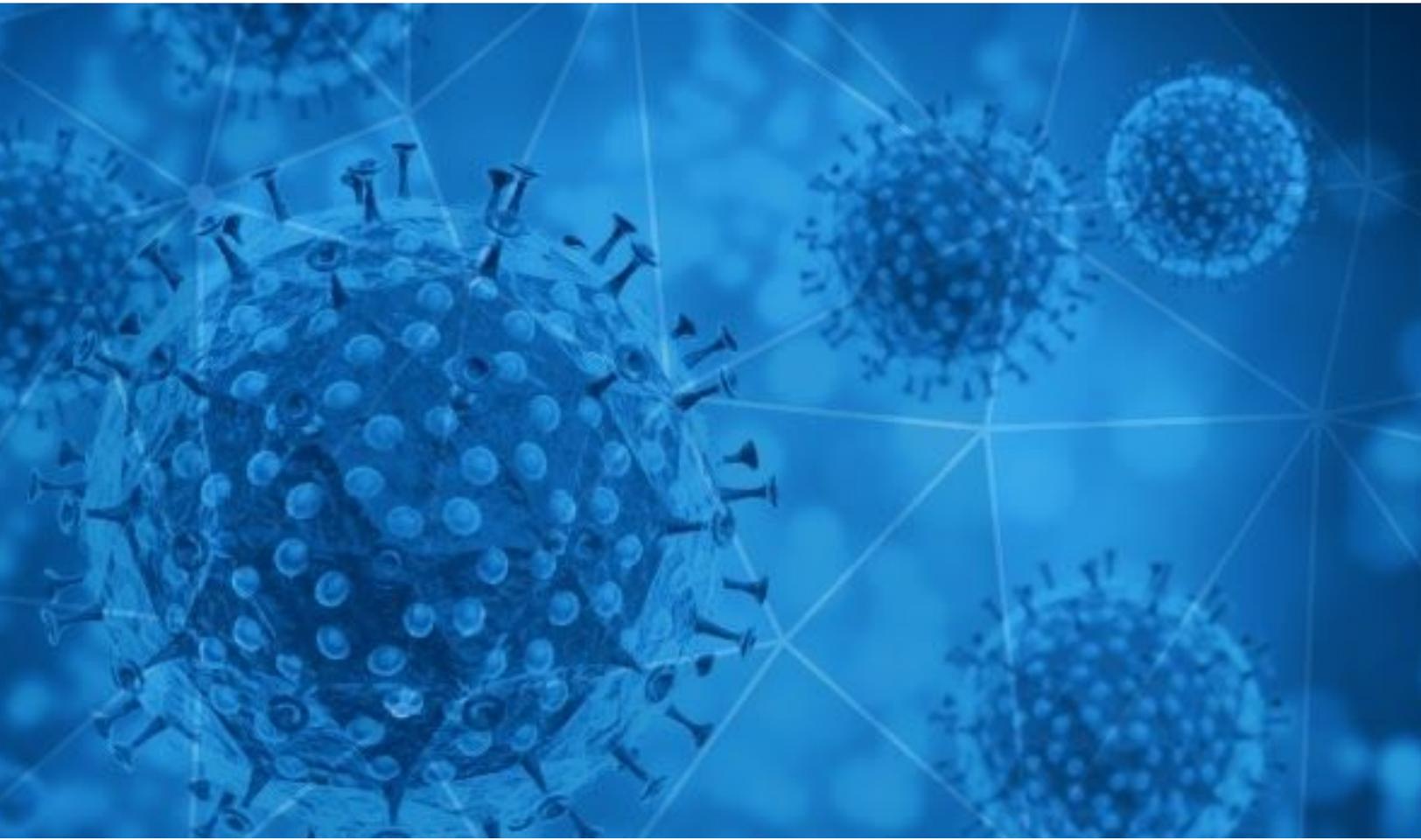

Noteable Events in the Past 24 Hours

[NASCAR will return](#) on 05/17/2020, becoming the the first American sport to resume activity since the COVID-19 pandemic began. NASCAR currently has two races planned for May, and neither race will allow fans to attend. The [NHL](#) hopes to move to “Phase 2” by mid-May, which would allow teams to open team facilities for small workouts.

Likewise, the [NBA](#) announced that it is targeting 05/08/2020 as the earliest date to open practice facilities in areas where stay-at-home orders have been lifted. Just three days after that announcement, however, team executives and player agents called on the league to [cancel the rest of the season](#).

[Forty percent of the workers at a Tyson Food plant](#) in Indiana have reportedly tested positive for COVID-19. The coronavirus infected 890 of the 2,200 people at the plant located in Logansport, Ind., local station WISH TV reported Wednesday.

Protesters in Michigan, some of whom were armed, [entered the Michigan Capitol](#) in protest of the stay-at-home orders. Outside the Capitol building, between 800 and 1,000 protesters gathered for the American Patriot Rally, but the event was much smaller than the 04/15/2020 protests.

The COVID-19 death toll in the UK is [rapidly rising](#) toward that of Italy, Europe’s hardest hit nation.

Italy on Thursday experienced its [largest daily drop in active cases](#) since the pandemic began, reporting a decrease by 3,106 of active cases. Recoveries are also climbing, with 75,945 patients now considered recovered. However, Italy’s commissioner for the pandemic said the country was now prepared for a second, and likely worse, wave of infections.

French officials announced a plan to reopen the country, but cautioned they may need to take a [“stop-and-go”](#) approach based on new waves of cases. Under the “stop-and-go” strategy, there would be alternating periods of lockdowns and then easing restrictions. Some epidemiologists speculate that cycling through lockdown periods may be necessary for an extended period of time, possibly years, until a vaccine is widely available.

Germany experienced [an increase in COVID-19 cases](#) after easing lockdown measures. During the lockdown period, patients were infecting 0.7 individuals, but the rate jumped to 0.96 after lockdown measures were scaled back. Experts cautioned that the infection rate is too close to 1.0, which is the threshold countries should aim to stay below to keep the virus manageable.

Since February, just 10,981 [residents of Tokyo](#) have been tested for Covid-19. Of those, just over 4,000 were positive. These testing numbers are beginning to raise questions.

Digital Exploitation

The US has seen [foreign spy agencies](#) carry out reconnaissance of research into a coronavirus vaccine, according to BBC reporting. Bill Evanina, director of the National Counterintelligence and Security Center, said the U.S. government had warned medical research organisations of the risks but he did not say whether there had been confirmed cases of stolen data.

Fraudsters have found a way to use the coronavirus pandemic for [blackmail](#), with one phishing scam threatening to 'infect every member' of victims' families with the disease. According to the Organized Crime and Corruption Reporting Project, the email was first publicly identified by internet security company Sophos, and demands \$4,000 from recipients.

Multiple threat actors running [phishing attacks](#) on corporate targets have been counting on Microsoft Sway service to trick victims into giving their Office 365 login credentials, according to BleepingComputer. Apart from access to corporate email accounts, scammers also get sensitive business data, which opens a wide range of money-making possibilities.

Following the April 26 release of Australian contact tracing mobile application CovidSafe, numerous users were erroneously marked as testing positive for COVID-19, according to LookingGlass reporting. While the number of affected users is unknown, developers are blaming user error as the cause.

Researchers at IBM X-Force have discovered a TrickBot campaign that spoofs the US Department of Labor and the message contains information regarding Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA). According to LookingGlass reporting, the phishing message attachment contains a DocuSign-themed document giving the appearance of legitimacy. The attachment contains macros and Terop.bat, Zipfldr.dll, and Robocopy.exe.

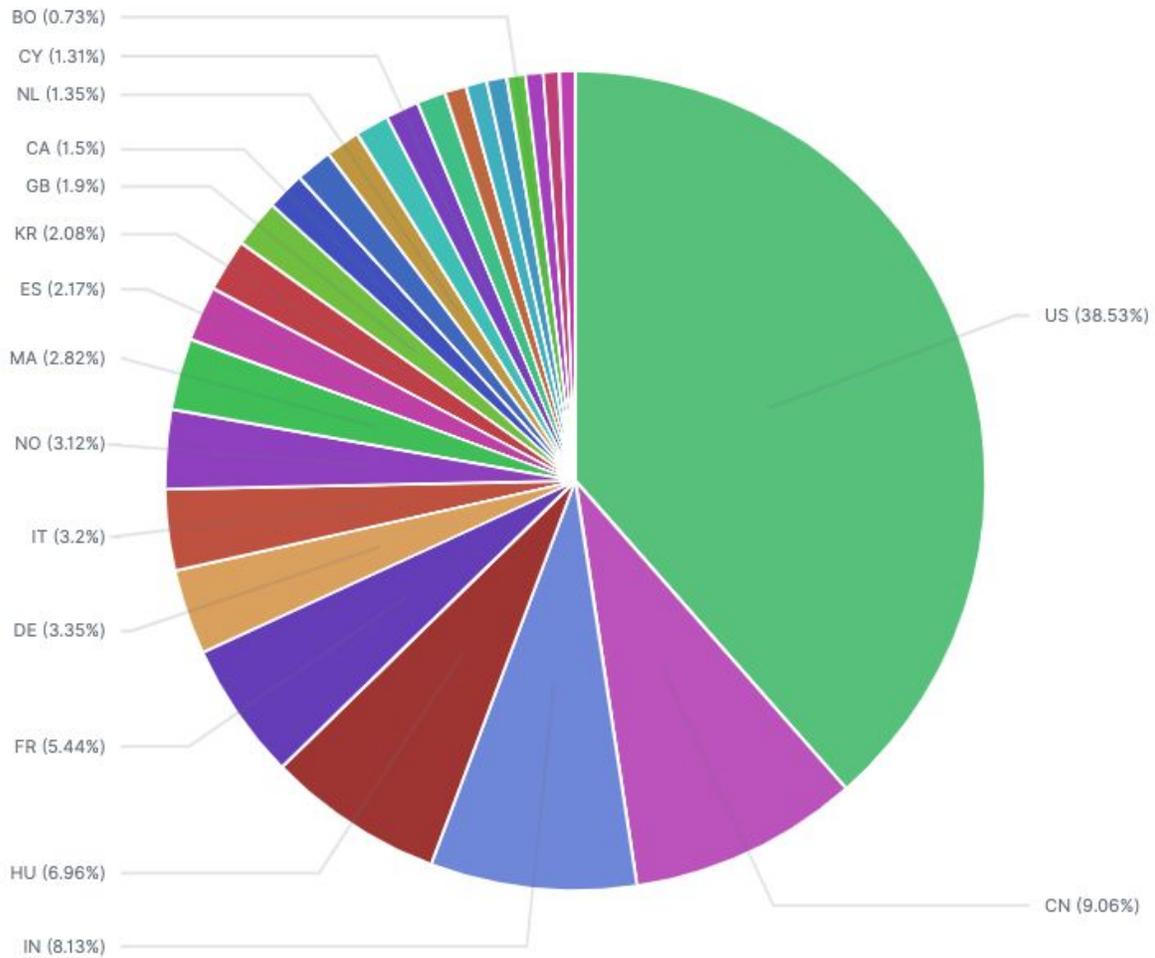

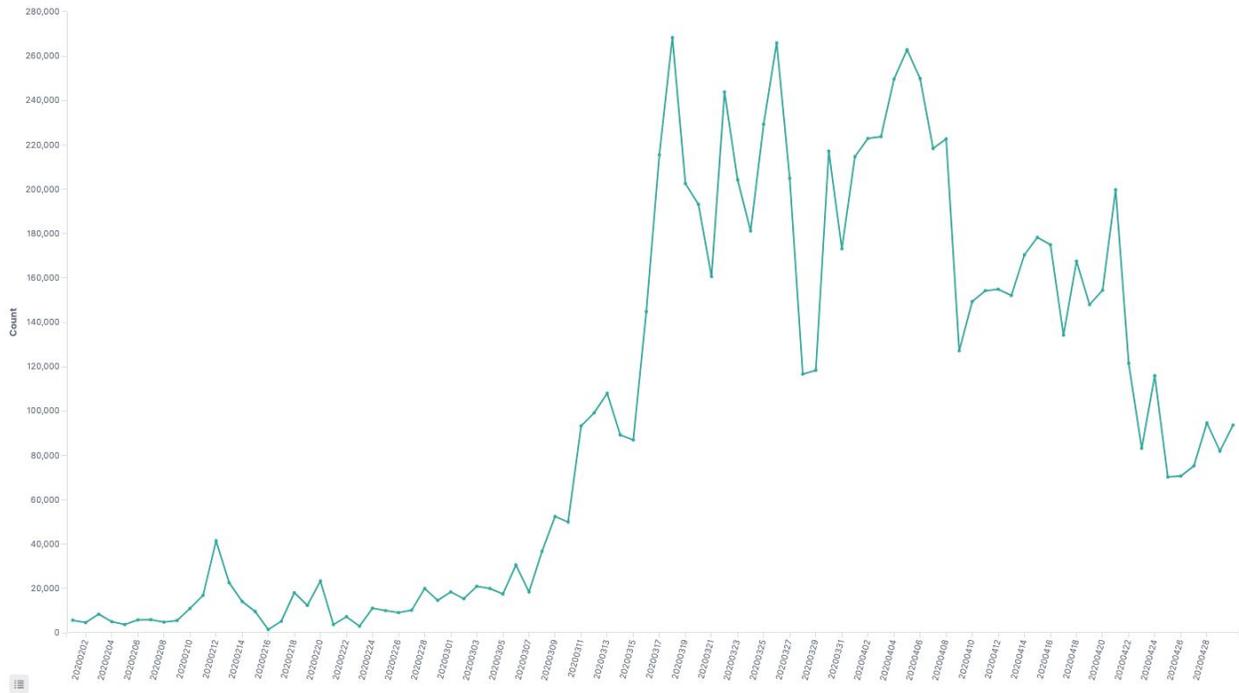

COVID-19 Email Spam Statistics

RiskIQ analyzed its spam box feed for the time period of 04/30/2020-05/01/2020. During this period, RiskIQ analyzed 93,634 spam emails containing either “*corona*” or “*covid*” in the subject line. There were 17,440 unique subject lines observed during the reporting period. The spam emails originated from 10,295 unique sending email domains and 11,549 unique SMTP IP Addresses. Analysts identified 11 emails which sent an executable file for Windows machines.

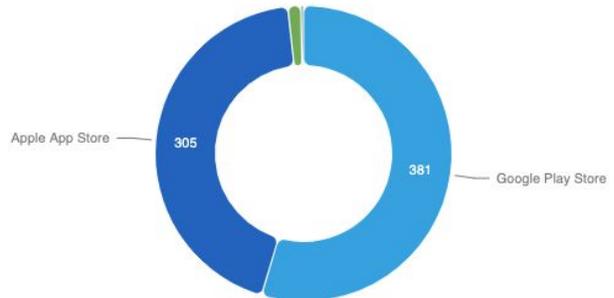

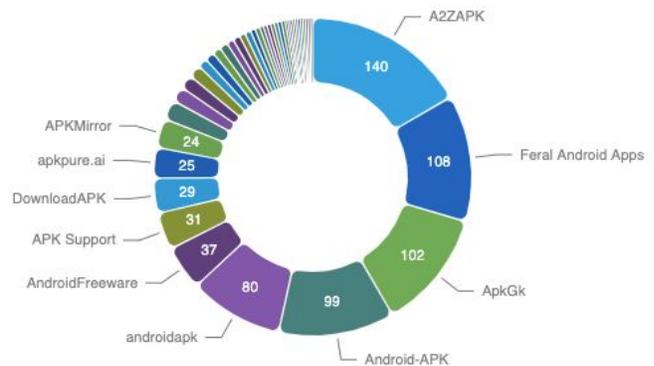

Governmental Guidance

State & Local Governments

California

As of 05/01/2020, California has 50,411 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 2,046 fatalities. California Governor Gavin Newsom [announced](#) on Thursday the closure of all beaches in Orange County in order to protect the public health after tens of thousands of people packed the beaches last weekend.

Illinois

As of 05/01/2020, Illinois has 52,918 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 2,355 fatalities. On Friday, Governor J.B. Pritzker's modified stay-at-home [order](#) will begin easing restrictions. State parks will be allowed to reopen, allowing fishing and boating in groups of no more than two people, who must still practice social distancing. Retail stores may also begin reopening with phone/online orders and pick-up outside the store. Greenhouses, nurseries, and animal grooming services have now been classified as essential businesses and may reopen. In accordance with the modified order residents must wear a facial covering when in a public space and continue to follow social distancing procedures.

New York

As of 05/01/2020, New York has 304,372 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 23,587 fatalities. Governor Andrew Cuomo [announced](#) Thursday the state will deploy a team to trace the movements of people who have come into close contact with individuals with COVID-19. The effort will be led by Mike Bloomberg, the former Mayor of New York City, and will be a key component of New York's reopening strategy.

Texas

As of 05/01/2020, Texas has 28,728 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 812 fatalities. Friday marks the beginning of lifting [orders](#) in Texas. Governor Greg Abbott's orders allow retail stores, restaurants, malls, and movies theaters to open at 25 percent capacity. The reopening follows

Thursday's report of the largest single day of fatalities due to COVID-19, and 1,000 newly reported COVID-19 cases.

Washington, DC

As of 05/01/2020, the Washington, D.C. region has a total of 41,912 confirmed cases of COVID-19, with 21,742 in Maryland, 15,847 in Virginia, and 4,323 in the District of Columbia. Maryland has 1,140 fatalities, Virginia has 552 fatalities, and the District of Columbia has 224 fatalities. On Thursday Washington, D.C. [reported](#) its highest death toll due to COVID-19 with 19 fatalities. D.C. Mayor Muriel Bowser [announced](#) agreements to construct two new hospitals in the District. Officials said the new hospitals will be built in Wards 7 and 8 to bring a broader health-care network to these areas.
