Notable Events in the Past 24 Hours

Two studies conducted by NYU researchers found that <u>age, obesity, and chronic illness</u> lead to higher hospitalization rates among COVID-19 patients. One study of 4,103 patients found that age and chronic illness—specifically, cardiovascular disease, diabetes and obesity—were the leading factors for hospitalization; this study is awaiting peer review. In another study, researchers found patients under 60 were at greater risk of hospitalization due to COVID-19 complications if they were obese. Obese, under-60 patients were nearly twice as likely to be hospitalized for acute and critical care.

The Supreme Court announced it will hear ten cases via <u>teleconference</u> in May after postponing cases in March and April. This marks the first time in its history the high court has heard arguments via teleconferencing and not in the courtroom. The court will provide a live audio feed to news outlets, also a first for the high court.

Harvard University researchers used computer modeling to evaluate the possible course of the COVID-19 virus over the next five years. The researchers said <u>prolonged or intermittent social distancing</u> may be required based on data revealed by the models. More specifically, researchers warned social distancing measures may be necessary into 2022 unless critical care capacity is increased or treatments or vaccinations become available.

President Trump instructed his administration to temporarily halt funding to the World Health Organization due to complaints it took China's word "at face value" and failed to share information about the pandemic early in its course. According to administration officials, the funding freeze will last for sixty days. The budget freeze has been met with significant criticisms from Bill Gates, security and public health scholars, and Democratic members of Congress.

Former White House health official Dr. Ezekiel Emanuel warned that <u>restarting the economy</u> must be done in stages. Emanuel said that large public gatherings—including sports events, conferences, and concerts—will likely not be safe to resume until fall 2021 at the earliest.

Schools and shops across Denmark are reopening, with more than <u>650,000 children</u> returning to daycare facilities and primary schools. Shops and schools are part of the first wave of a phased approach to reopening the country. Universities, churches, movie theaters, and shopping malls will remain closed until at least 05/10/2020; the ban on congregations of more than 100 people will remain in effect until August.

Protesters gathered outside the Michigan state capitol to <u>protest Governor Whitmer's stay-at-home order</u>. The protesters urged Whitmer to reopen non-essential businesses by 05/01/2020. The protest was organized by the Michigan Conservative Coalition.



Digital Exploitation

Two Canadian organizations involved in work on COVID-19—one a government body—have been the targets of recent <u>ransomware</u> attacks, according to a report from Palo Alto Networks Inc. In one of the attacks, targets received an email with a file attachment named "20200323-sitrep-63-covid-19.doc" that, if opened, would encrypt files on their computer until a ransom had been paid.

Hackread.com discovered on 04/11/2020 that the personal data of 1.41m US doctors was being sold on hacker forums. The physicians' data was stolen from qa.findadoctor[.]com, an online service that lets people search for healthcare professionals, book instant appointments, and consult with doctors online. The targeted website is based in Edison, NJ New Jersey and it claims to have registered 100,000+ doctors and 5,000+ members.

On 04/14/2020 Senators Mazie K. Hirono (D-Hawaii), Cory Booker (D-N.J.), and Maggie Hassan (D-N.H.) called on the leaders of eight domain name registrars and hosting sites to combat scams and misinformation during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Senators asked the executives of GoDaddy, Dynadot, Donuts Inc., Namecheap Inc., Web.com, Endurance International Group, InMotion Hosting, and DreamHost to explain the steps their companies are taking to combat misinformation about the COVID-19 pandemic.



COVID-19 Email Spam Statistics

RiskIQ analyzed its spam box feed for the time period of 04/14/2020-04/15/2020. During this period, RiskIQ analyzed 170,387 spam emails containing either "*corona*" or "*covid*" in the subject line. There were 18,453 unique subject lines observed during the reporting period. The spam emails originated from 8,391 unique sending email domains and 19,694 unique SMTP IP Addresses. Analysts identified 583 emails which sent an executable file for Windows machines.





Governmental Guidance

State & Local Governments

California

As of 04/15/2020, California has 25,779 confirmed COVID-19 cases and 790 deaths. Governor Gavin Newsom <u>announced</u> Tuesday a roadmap for reopening society and businesses across the state. The roadmap lists six key indicators the state will focus on meeting in order to consider modifying the current stay-at-home order. Gov. Newsom noted even if the order is lifted society may be different at first. He offered examples that restaurants may restrict the number of guests, and face coverings may be common in public.

Illinois

As of 04/15/2020, Illinois has 23,248 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 869 deaths. Governor J.B. Pritzker <u>stated</u> Tuesday that data suggests Illinois is bending the curve of those affected with COVID-19. The increased capacity at hospitals across the state has resulted in a decreased percentage of occupied ICU beds and occupied ventilators. Governor Pritzker also stated talks are in motion with neighboring Midwestern governors to work together on lifting the stay-at-home orders as a region.

New York

As of 04/15/2020, New York has 203,377 confirmed COVID-19 cases and 10,842 deaths. Governor Andrew Cuomo <u>issued</u> an executive order today that requires New York citizens to wear a face mask in most public areas. Mayor Bill de Blasio of New York City <u>acknowledged</u> the city has struggled to get an accurate count of COVID-19 related deaths as more people die at home. New York City officials stated Tuesday they will begin counting "probable" COVID-19 deaths of those who are believed to have died due to COVID-19 but had no known positive laboratory test.

Texas

As of 04/15/2020, Texas has 15,343 confirmed cases of COVID-19 cases and 362 deaths. The Texas Public Health Coalition stated their support in Governor Abbott's plan to gradually reopen



the Texas economy. The state is currently flattening the curve of COVID-19-affected individuals, but community transmission is still occuring. The state health department <u>announced</u> that as of Tuesday, 2,580 individuals recovered from COVID-19 in Texas. As people are recovering, lawmakers continue to push for more COVID-19 testing throughout the state.

Washington, DC

As of 04/15/2020, the Washington, D.C. region has a total of 16,638 confirmed COVID-19 cases with 6,182 in Virginia, 9,472 in Maryland, and 2,058 in the District. The District of Columbia has a total of 67 deaths, Virginia has 157 deaths, and Maryland has 302 deaths. On Tuesday, with more than 500 deaths the D.C. region <u>experienced</u> the highest single-day increase in COVID-19-related deaths since the beginning of the pandemic. D.C. Mayor Muriel Bowser said Tuesday that the District may see a peak in COVID-19 cases as early as May.
