Notable Events in the Past 24 Hours

Texas Gov. Greg Abbott issued three executive orders Friday that outline how to reopen the state amid the COVID-19 pandemic. The announcement from the governor has been long awaited, with Abbott adding that the state and its decisions must be guided by data and doctors.

New York Governor Andrew Cuomo announced on Twitter that the "New York on PAUSE" order will be extended until 05/15/2020. Cuomo laid out a <u>four-point strategy</u> for reopening the state, which necessitates controlling the rate of infection, strengthening the healthcare system, developing a federal partnership for testing/tracing, and utilizing a phased return.

The Trump administration released <u>guidance</u> for states when developing a reopening strategy. The administration provided an 18-page document to governors on Thursday, 04/16/2020. The document recommends states see a downward trajectory in both confirmed COVID-19 cases and flu-like symptoms before moving to reopen their states. The guidelines further recommend that states and regions see a decline in confirmed cases over a fourteen day period, ensure hospitals can handle all patients without crisis care, and be able to provide a comprehensive testing program—including antibody tests—for at-risk health workers.

The <u>Chinese economy</u> contracted 6.8% in the first quarter, which marks the first time the nation's economy shrank in several decades. The decline demonstrates a stark contrast with economic gains from a year prior when China saw 6.4% growth in the first quarter of 2019. In addition, Chinese manufacturing was down 1.1% in March, retail sales dropped 15.8%, and unemployment dropped to 5.9% after sitting at 6.2% in February.

On Thursday, the Senate <u>adjourned</u> for a week after failing to come to an agreement over hundreds of billions of dollars in small-business funding. The Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) has run out of funding and has shut down as a result. Republicans want to pass a stand-alone bill for \$250 billion in funding to the PPP, while Democrats want to include \$100 billion for hospitals, \$150 billion for states and a boost in food assistance funding.

The entire crew of the <u>USS Theodore Roosevelt</u> was tested for COVID-19. Interestingly, the test revealed the majority of positive cases were asymptomatic. Approximately 60% of the sailors who tested positive for the virus have so far shown no symptoms, though it is unclear how many will eventually develop symptoms and how many will remain asymptomatic. These numbers are consistent with the test results for the passengers and crew of the <u>Diamond Princess</u>, analyzed by the CDC in late March. Moreover, these findings have possible implications for policy makers grappling with how to reopen the country.



Many <u>states without stay-at-home orders</u> are experiencing significant spikes in confirmed cases when compared to states with such orders in place. Over the past week, cases have grown by 53% in Oklahoma, 60% in Arkansas, 74% in Nebraska, 82% in Iowa, and 205% in South Dakota. The remaining three states without stay-at-home orders are seeing an increase in cases, but the growth is more in line with states with stay-at-home orders.



Digital Exploitation

The FBI has seen a spike in cyber crimes reported to its Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3) since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, as both domestic and international hackers look to take advantage of Americans' daily activities moving increasingly online. The FBI has received between 3,000 to 4,000 cybersecurity complaints each day, a major jump from the days prior to the COVID-19 pandemic when about 1,000 complaints were received daily.

<u>Google</u> says it blocks 18 million COVID-19-related scam emails each day and that's not counting more than 240 million daily spam messages launched at Gmail users that try to capitalize on the coronavirus crisis.

A cybersecurity resource, developed jointly by the <u>American Medical Association and American Hospital Association (AHA)</u>, gives guidance on protecting remote workplaces, as many physicians now work from home to care for patients during the COVID-19 pandemic. The resource, "Working from home during the COVID-19 pandemic," tells physicians about immediate steps they can take to strengthen home or hospital-based computers, networks, and medical devices from the rise in COVID-19-themed security threats and attacks. The resource includes checklists, sources, tips, and advice on bolstering protections to keep pace with deceptive cyberattacks that could disrupt patient care or threaten medical records.



COVID-19 Email Spam Statistics

RiskIQ analyzed its spam box feed for the time period of 04/16/2020-04/17/2020. During this period, RiskIQ analyzed 174,931 spam emails containing either "*corona*" or "*covid*" in the subject line. There were 17,352 unique subject lines observed during the reporting period. The spam emails originated from 24,551 unique sending email domains and 16,185 unique SMTP IP Addresses. Analysts identified 28,480 emails which sent an executable file for Windows machines.





Governmental Guidance

State & Local Governments

California

As of 04/17/2020, California has 28,157 confirmed COVID-19 cases and 973 deaths. The number of deaths due to COVID-19 in California hit new highs this week. Wednesday, 04/15/2020, saw the worst one-day total for California, with 101 deaths reported. With 457 fatalities, Los Angeles County has accounted for almost half the COVID-19 deaths in the state of California. Nearly 88% of those who died due to COVID-19 in Los Angeles County had previous health problems.

Illinois

As of 04/17/2020, Illinois has 25,733 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 1,073 deaths. The state of Illinois spent \$17 million on KN95 masks from China that may not be usable. The KN95 masks were approved as an alternative to the N95 masks by the CDC earlier this month. Missouri officials have recalled thousands of KN95 masks after reviews revealed they did not meet state standards. Yesterday, the Illinois Department of Public Health issued guidance they would not recall previously-distributed masks and advised that first responders use the masks as "crisis alternatives."

New York

As of 04/17/2020, New York has 223,691 confirmed COVID-19 cases and 14,832 deaths. Mayor Bill de Blasio announced all nonessential events, including concerts and festivals, will be cancelled through May and possibly June. This announcement led to the cancellation of two large events for New York City: the Brooklyn Half Marathon scheduled for 04/16/2020 and SummerStage in Central Park scheduled for 06/22/2020. Governor Andrew Cuomo extended the stay-at-home order for the state to at least 05/15/2020; he noted any change in behavior could lead to a longer stay-at-home order.



Texas

As of 04/17/2020, Texas has 17,263 confirmed cases of COVID-19 cases and 421 deaths. San Antonio and Dallas <u>issued</u> emergency orders that residents must wear a face mask in public spaces. The order noted that residents may also use scarves, bandannas, or handkerchiefs in place of a medical mask. In both areas if residents fail to follow the order they will be fined \$1,000 and face possible jail time.

Washington, DC

As of 04/17/2020, the Washington, D.C. region has a total of 20,023 confirmed COVID-19 cases with 6,889 in Virginia, 10,784 in Maryland, and 2,350 in the District. The District of Columbia has a total of 86 deaths, Virginia has 231 deaths, and Maryland has 294 deaths. Mayor Muriel Bowser <u>stated</u> residents who filed for unemployment will receive an extra \$600 per week starting next week. Residents in Maryland and Virginia who have filed for unemployment will also receive the \$600 soon. Mayor Bowser also urged D.C. voters to request mail-in ballots by 05/26/2020 and to fill out their census forms.
