Notable Events: Previous 24 Hours

After exceeding 82,000 confirmed cases on Thursday, 03/26/2020, the U.S. overtook China with the <u>highest count</u> of COVID-19 cases in the world. The U.S. has administered 418,000 tests across the country through both the CDC and private labs.

The House passed a \$2 trillion coronavirus relief bill on Friday, sending the unprecedented measure to President Donald Trump's desk after a scramble to block efforts to delay its passage.

Researchers at the University of Washington School of Medicine <u>assessed</u> the U.S. could see between 38,000 and 162,000 fatalities related to COVID-19, and cases may not begin to subside until June 2020. The researchers expect the number of hospitalizations to peak nationally by the second week of April, but some states might not hit their peak until later.

UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson <u>tested positive</u> for COVID-19 after developing what he called "mild symptoms", including a fever and persistent cough. Johnson is self-quarantined at home, where he will continue to work remotely. UK Health Secretary Matt Hancock also tested positive for the virus.

Service Employees International Union United Healthcare Workers West announced it <u>located 39 million N95 masks</u> and would provide them to state and local governments, as well as healthcare providers. The union also said it found a supplier which can produce 20 million masks per week and another which can produce millions of protective face shields.

Dyson founder James Dyson said the company has designed a <u>new ventilator</u> and will produce 15,000 units. Dyson reported the UK government ordered 10,000 ventilators. The ventilators will reportedly be ready by early April. In the U.S., Ford, Tesla, and GM are also working to make ventilators.

In Israel, First Robotics League, Microsoft Israel Research and Development, Ichilov Medical Center, Magen David Adom, and Unit 108 of the Air Force are coming together to work on a solution to the nation's <u>respirator shortage</u>. The group aims to create an open source respirator that can be mass produced in labs at a low cost.

Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition and Sustainment Ellen Lord warned <u>adversary</u> <u>nations</u> may use economic turmoil as a means to buy out American-made technologies. The Pentagon has expressed concerns over the last several years that foreign nations such as China are investing in U.S. startup companies that have national security applications.



Digital Exploitation

There has been a steady increase in the number of COVID-19-related <u>email attacks</u> since January, according to security firm Barracuda Networks, but researchers observed a recent spike in this type of attack, up 667% since the end of February. According to TechRepublic reporting, between March 1 and March 23, researchers detected 467,825 spear phishing email attacks, and 9,116 of those detections were related to COVID-19, representing about 2% of attacks.

According to Naked Security reporting on 03/26/2020, researchers have seen evidence that hackers are targeting <u>home delivery</u> food apps. The hackers use the apps in an effort to scam customers out of their personal information, including their credit card numbers.

A new COVID-19 <u>bitcoin scam</u> promises victims "millions" by working from home. According to a Malwarebytes blog posting, the dubious COVID-19 bitcoin missives are sent via phishing emails.



COVID-19 Email Spam Statistics

RiskIQ analyzed its spam box feed for the time period of 03/26/2020-03/27/2020. During this period, RiskIQ analyzed 265,952 spam emails containing either "*corona*" or "*covid*" in the subject line. There were 20,588 unique subject lines observed during the reporting period. The spam emails originated from 31,734 unique sending email domains and 24,306 unique SMTP IP Addresses. Analysts identified 163 emails which sent an executable file for Windows machines.





Governmental Guidance

State & Local Governments

California

As of 03/27/2020, California has 4,040 confirmed COVID-19 cases and 82 deaths. All DMV field offices in California will temporarily close amid the novel coronavirus outbreak, officials said Thursday. The statewide closure will begin Friday. Offices will reopen virtually on April 2, and customers will be able to complete vehicle title transfers and complex vehicle registration renewals.

Illinois

As of 03/27/2020, Illinois has 2,539 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 26 deaths. Chicago officials are <u>asking</u> anyone who sees a nonessential business still operating in violation of the state's stay-at-home order to call 311 to report the business. City inspectors are responding to complaints, and enforcing the order, including issuing citations that can cost businesses up to \$10,000 per violation. The city is also checking to make sure businesses don't force employees to come to work while they're sick. Businesses that don't grant paid sick leave to their employees can be fined up to \$1,000 per violation.

Massachusetts

As of 03/27/2020, Massachusetts has 2,417 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 25 deaths. The deans at Tufts School of Medicine, Harvard Medical School, Boston University School of Medicine and the University of Massachusetts Medical School agreed to the state's request to move graduation up a month, effectively making 700 new doctors available to fight the outbreak. The graduates would be able to apply for 90-day provisional licenses that would allow them to work at hospitals that are seeing a surge in coronavirus patients.

New York

As of 03/27/2020, New York has 39,140 confirmed COVID-19 cases and 461 deaths. New York City makes up more than half of the statewide cases of COVID-19 with 23,112. Several states on Thursday <u>issued</u> new rules for travelers arriving from New York and surrounding areas. Rhode Island is stationing members of the National Guard at bus stations, where those arriving from New York will be required to provide ID and contact information. Those traveling in a car



with a New York license plate will be pulled over by Rhode Island state police and required to reveal where they're staying and provide contact information.

Washington, DC

As of 03/27/2020, the Washington, D.C.-region has a total of 1,652 confirmed COVID-19 cases with 606 in Virginia, 775 in Maryland, and 271 in the District. D.C. officials <u>announced</u> Friday the city will reduce most in-person voting for the June 2 primary election to 20 to help reduce coronavirus transmission risk. They are encouraging people to instead request mail-in ballots. The city is also expanding early voting to run May 22 through June 2.
